

ELKHART LIONS 2018-2019 SERVICE ACTIVITIES

- 1. EAP (Eyeglass Assistance Program) Elkhart Lions Club member, Dr. David Britzke, and other Elkhart Eye Professionals provide vision exams and glasses for low income students and adults. In 2018-2019, 109 individuals (69 students and 40 adults) were approved to receive exams and glasses.
- **2. ETHOS SCIENCE 2 GO BUS PROJECT -** The Elkhart Lions Club gave \$15,000.00 to sponsor upgrades to the technology on the ETHOS Science 2 Go Bus.
- **3. Dictionary Project –1300-1400+** dictionaries are given to 3rd grade students and JAG students in the Elkhart Schools at a cost of over \$3500.00. The dictionaries are used at school and at home.
- **4. Youth Arts 2018** The club helped sponsor Youth Art 2018 in conjunction with the Midwest Museum of Art and National Youth Month.
- 5. Youth baseball The club sponsored a team in The Osolo Little League
- 6. SchoolSight The Elkhart Lions helped with the Eye Screenings of 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 8th grade students in 15 public schools. From August, 2018-March, 2019, 5,236 students were screened 33% were referred for further testing. KidSight Eye screenings of preschool students. Head Start students (419) were screened in the fall. 17% were referred. Spring screening is conducted in private preschools. 470 preschool and daycare students were screened. Totals for both projects –6,125 students screened from August, 2018, to May, 2019.
- 7. Eyeglass collection Many members participate by collecting used eyeglasses.
- **8.** Eyeglass Wash-a-Thons-Members joined with other lions from our area to wash and recycle over 3000+ pairs of glasses at each wash-a-thon. All together, 18,430 pairs of glasses were recycled from Nov., 2018 to June, 2019, to use in the Eye Glass Mission to Mexico.
- **9.** Eyeglass Recycling Donated eyeglasses have their prescriptions read and labeled; glasses are repaired, sorted, filed and boxed according to prescriptions to be transported to Mexico for the Eyeglass Mission.
- 10. Christmas Giving Members contributed money and the club matched funds to support the Mosaic Program (adopt 2 clients) and Salvation Army Adopt a Family
- **11. Eyeglass Mission to Mexico** Several members spent one week in Sept., 2018, in Mexico fitting and distributing eyeglasses to clients. The next mission trip will be in Oct., 2019.
- 12. Scholarships Money is donated to the Elkhart Dollars for Scholars Fund every year.
- 13. Recycling Members collect water bottles, medicine bottles and caps, can tabs, and Box Tops for Education. The club collected *over 200 lbs of recyclable plastic* and partnering with the Garden Club turned it into four park benches for use in Elkhart. One will be placed in Walker Park, one at the Train Depot, one at the Elkhart Lions flagpole on Main Street, and the fourth one at the playground at McNaughton Park.
- **14.** The Elkhart Lions contributed \$200 to fund a year-end picnic for low vision students and their families in Elkhart County.
- **15. State Projects.** The club supports (\$1000@) the five state projects Leader Dog, Cancer Control, School for the Blind, Eye and Tissue Bank, and Speech and Hearing. **FUNDRAISING**
- **16. Newspaper Sales** Many members participate by selling ads in *The Lion Tales* and the papers are distributed in December. This is the main fundraiser generating funds for the club's service projects.
- **17. Flags From The Heart** Dedicated flags are flown in Central Park in downtown Elkhart over the Memorial Day weekend. 137 dedicated flags were flown in 2019.
- 18. Spring and Fall Chicken BBQ Many members participate by selling tickets and working the BBQ.
- **19. Rhapsody Art and Music Festival** –Water, hot dogs, soda and popcorn were sold from the concession trailer. Many members participated by working 2-3 hour shifts over three days in June.
- **20. Pie Sales.** Pies are sold at Elkhart Municipal Band concerts to raise funds for service projects **PAST PROJECT**
 - **Loop The Lerner** The Elkhart Lions Club contributed \$10,000.00 to help wire the Lerner Theatre and Crystal Ballroom to help hearing aid users with amplification. **Centennial Project**
